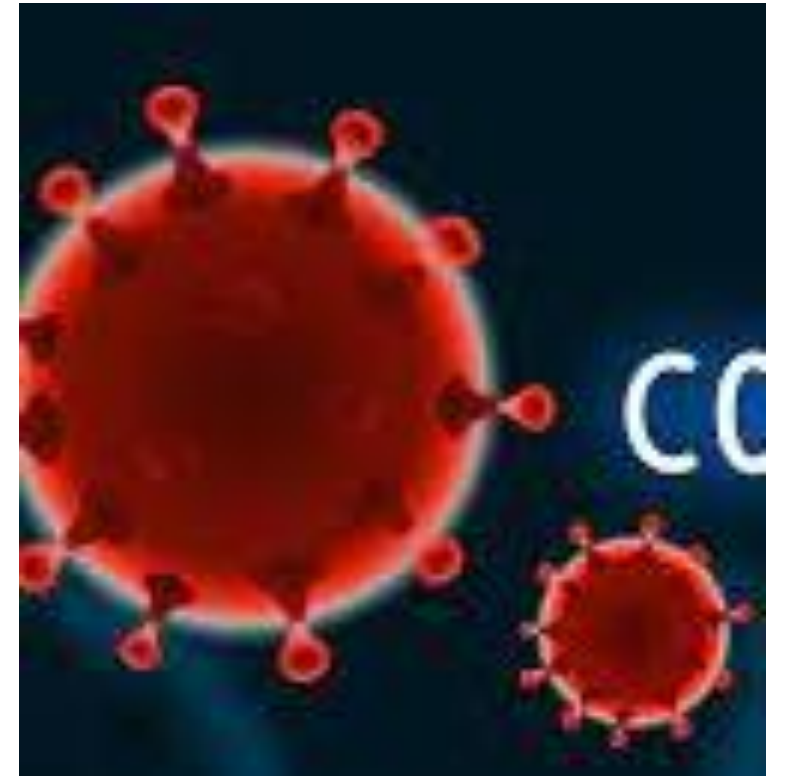

Objective

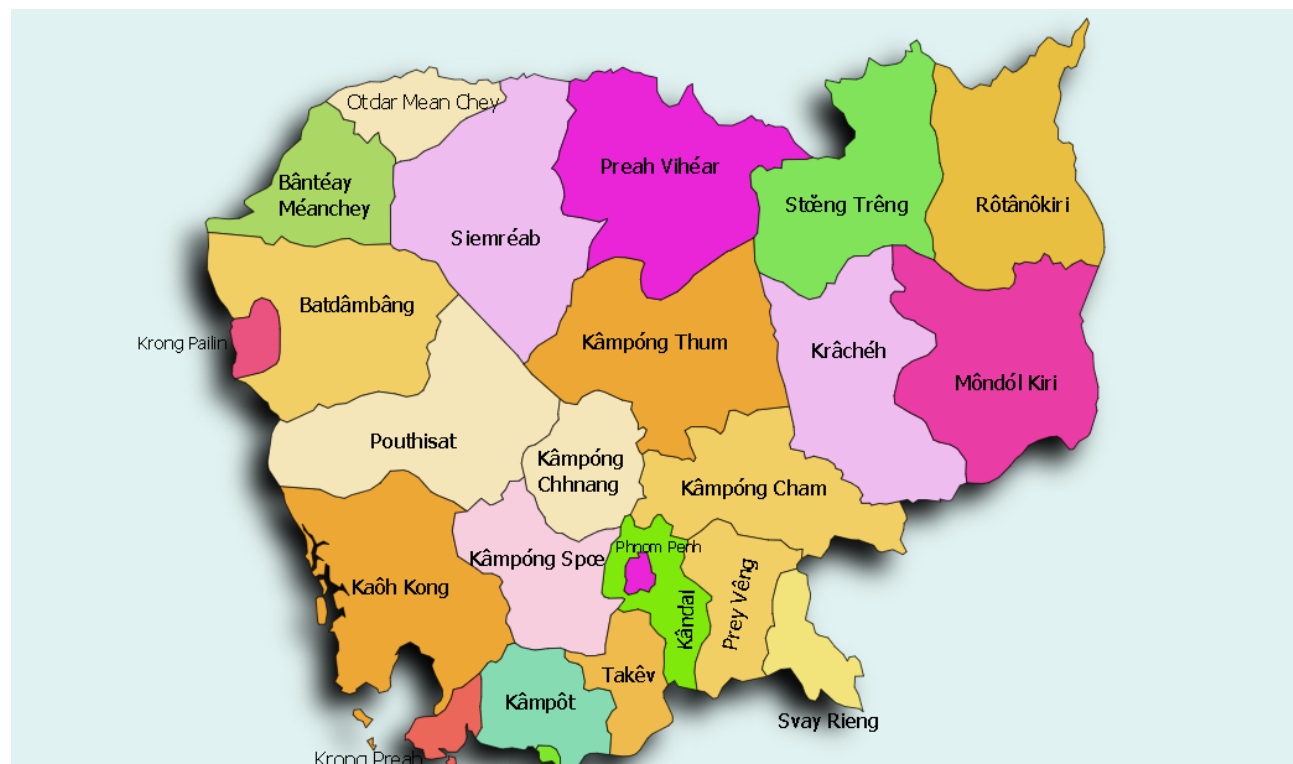
To improve the food and nutrition security and dietary diversity of women of reproductive age, in particular pregnant and lactating women, and children under the age of two years.






- ✓ **Target group:** 15,000 WRA & 3,000 children U2 (**IDDS / MAD**)
- ✓ **Interv. area:** 180 villages in KT & KP
- ✓ **Duration:** 03/2015 – 03/2026
- ✓ **Budget Mio €:** up to 24,3 EUR

Achievements up to 2021...

*Output 1: Nutrition Counselling
at Community Level*

- ✓ **18.712 WRA reached**
- ✓ **55%** of women and **44%** of men choosing nutritious food
- ✓ **73%** of women and **72%** of men confirmed knowledge on balanced diet & basic hygiene
- ✓ **79%** of WRA have confirmed knowledge on how to provide a balanced diet and basic hygiene



Achievements up to 2021...

*Output 2: Nutrition-specific
Capacity Development of
Health Staff and VHSGs*

- ✓ **78.3%** of health center visitors confirm that they have been advised on the Growth Monitoring Policy
- ✓ **71.86%** of the 540 trained HC staff apply the knowledge
- ✓ **100%** of the 532 trained VHSG apply their knowledge in the Care Group Sessions.



Achievements up to 2021 ...

Output 3: Private Sector & Agriculture

- ✓ **27%** of CEW applying knowledge on nutrition sensitive agriculture.
- ✓ **37%** of street food vendors applying new recipes.
- ✓ **735** Villagers saved and invested **33.760 USD** (#Saving for Chan@ge)

- ✓ 35% of PWG-FNS members applying knowledge
- ✓ Budget analysis

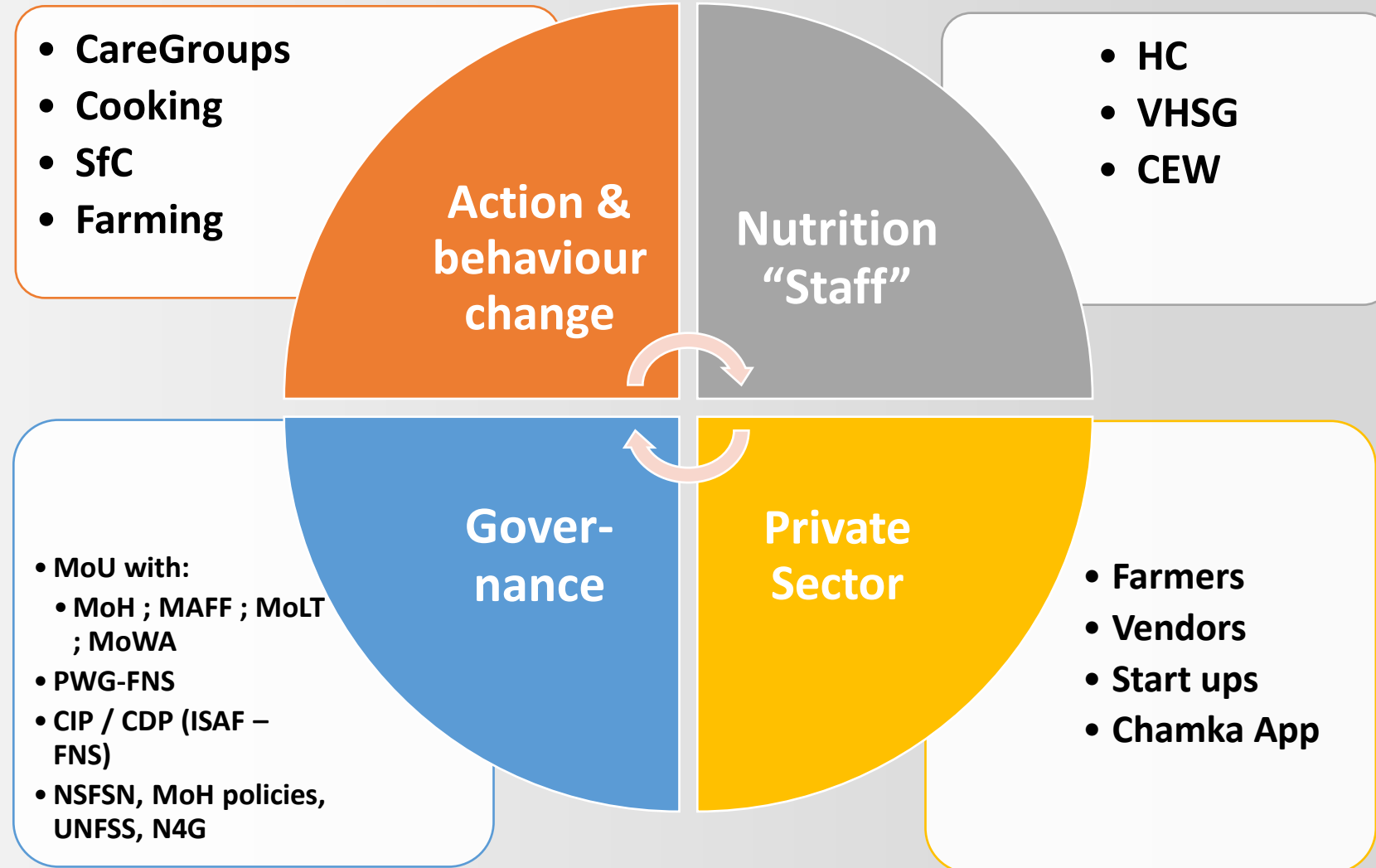

- ✓ ISPA-FSN-tool
- ✓ Street Food Vendors (certification)
- ✓ Growth monitoring & Malnutrition screening
- ✓ Nutrition Counselling APP (MoH)
- ✓ WBT (CARD/MAFF)
- ✓ Monitoring & Decision support tools (SUN-Tool)
- ✓ Nutritional guidelines (update from 3 to 5)
